



EACS HIV Summer School (5-9/09/16)

- 72 participants, 34 scholarships
- 33 countries
- 19 faculty members

Medical Exchange Programme

- 15 applicants
- 5 selected for the review

European Young Investigators – YING (16/12/16)

- 19 young scientists on the Scientific Committee
- 49 participants confirmed; aim 60
- 19 countries represented

Clinical Management of HIV online Course

- 1169 participants enrolled
- 160 submitted the final exam
- 61% (n=98) with at least 80% correct answers.




