Interview with WAVE Chair, Prof. Yvonne Gilleece on women in HIV clinical trials and studies

For International Women's Day we spoke with Prof. Yvonne Gilleece about WAVE's activities and including more women in HIV clinical trials and studies:

"WAVE has promoted the inclusion of women in clinical trials by funding projects, surveys and literature reviews that define knowledge gaps and areas for further research. We highlighted this recently at our workshop at EACS, London 2021 by sharing updates on our projects so far such as HIV in Migrant Women and Comorbidities in Women living with HIV, as well as a specific presentation on Women and Clinical Trials. WAVE also provides a link between scientific organisations, researchers, healthcare providers and community representatives to facilitate collaborations and joint working between countries on research ideas and studies. WAVE will continue its work to promote new women-specific studies and also to lobby for the inclusion of more women in HIV clinical trials and studies."


Register for the 'PentaTr@ining 2022: HIV & other Congenital Infections'
