Apply for the Short Clinical Exchange Programme

Statement on Ensuring high-quality of HIV Care for displaced people from Ukraine

On 13 April, EACS released a multi-partner statement urging nations across Europe to provide easily accessible, high-quality HIV care for displaced people from Ukraine living with HIV.

This was in conjunction with a protocol for standardised management and data sharing for people displaced from Ukraine living with HIV also released today. This was developed by the World Health Organisations European Office, in partnership with the European AIDS Clinical Society (EACS), the WHO Collaborating Centre at the Centre of Excellence for Health, Immunity and Infections (CHIP), the Euroguidelines in Central and Eastern Europe (ECEE) network group and the Public Health Centre, MOH, Ukraine.

The statement is now available in Ukrainian, Czech, Polish, Romanian, Hungarian and Slovak.


