## HIV Summer School 2025: Learning, Sharing, and Connecting in Lyon



From 1–5 September, the 23rd edition of the **HIV Summer School** took place in Lyon, France, welcoming 60 participants from 28 countries. For five days, early-career clinicians and researchers came together to learn, share, and connect in an intensive programme guided by leading experts in the field of HIV.

The week combined lectures with lively discussions and group work. Participants followed either the clinical or research track: the clinical groups explored case studies and debated hot topics in HIV care, while the research groups developed their own research projects.

More than just a course, the **HIV Summer School is a space for collaboration, exchange, and lasting connections.** We hope that the friendships and networks built this year will continue to inspire and support participants throughout their careers.

The next edition will take place in September 2026 – keep an eye on our communication channels for details on how to apply.

## Now available: WAVE article on European Guidelines for HIV and breastfeeding

The research article entitled 'European Guidelines on HIV and breastfeeding: "Same, same, but different" - Results from a WAVE survey' is now published in HIV Medicine.

The WAVE (Women Against Viruses in Europe) study aimed to consolidate European guidelines on HIV and breastfeeding to better inform medical staff and people living with HIV in the decision-making process for breastfeeding. Nineteen national guidelines from 20 European countries were translated into English, reviewed and summarised into key topics. While most countries recommend formula feeding, many also offer guidance for breastfeeding under specific conditions. Despite relying on the same evidence, the guidelines vary, e.g. in breastfeeding duration, and often lack clarity around mixed feeding.

This review consolidates European guidelines, encourages shared learning and lays the foundation for future research and guideline development for parents living with HIV and their infants.

On the last day of EACS 2025, Saturday, 18 October 2025, the "Living Free with HIV" charity run will be organised. The event begins at 15:00 in the Bois de Boulogne. The 4.2 km route combines forest paths, roads temporarily closed to traffic, and sections along the lake.

The run aims to raise awareness about **HIV-related stigma and discrimination**, while promoting **health, dignity, and equal rights** for people living with HIV. All participants support the French NGO **Les petits bonheurs**, which brings moments of joy to people living with HIV and fosters positive change.

Participation is open to everyone. While the event itself is free to attend, joining the run involves a **symbolic donation**:

- 10 EUR for regular participants
- 5 EUR for students and community members

Registration includes a **bib number** and a **finisher's medal**, and T-shirts can be pre-ordered during registration. You can also **run**, **walk**, **or cheer from the sidelines**—all contributions help highlight solidarity and inclusion.

## **ECDC Invitation to Contribute Best Practices: Migrant Health in Europe**

The European Centre for Disease Prevention and Control (ECDC) has commissioned the MI-GOOD-CARE project, led by the Barcelona Institute for Global Health (ISGlobal) to identify and collect good practice interventions on the prevention and management of HIV, viral hepatitis, tuberculosis (TB), and sexually transmitted infections (STIs) among migrant populations in Europe.

The goal of this project is to support EU/EEA Member States in reducing the burden of undiagnosed and untreated infections within migrant communities.

Submit your model of care for consideration as a best practice today if you are working on interventions that:

- Increase testing
- · Improve linkage to care
- Strengthen retention in care

The survey will take approximately 45 minutes to complete. We strongly encourage you and your colleagues to also submit your own interventions. After evaluation, a final compilation of good practice models will be published.

### The 'Ask Us' Europe survey study needs your help!

Led by Professor Chloe Orkin of the SHARE Research Collaborative, the 'Ask Us' Europe survey explores patient perspectives on whether new HIV treatment options, such as injectables and novel oral therapies, are being discussed during medical consultations.

The study will evaluate whether these options are offered equally to all groups, including key populations like women, transgender and non-binary people and people from ethnically diverse backgrounds. To date, nearly 900 people across 17 countries have responded. However, <20% are cisgender women, and transgender women are very poorly represented.

The study is conducted in partnership with EATG and UK-CAB and has been co-designed together with a community advisory board of community members from 17 countries.

The advert and survey are available in 18 languages.

EACS, and specifically WAVE, supports this study and would like to assist to increase recruitment.
